

What are the **Waste** from **Finished Textile Products**?

The expression «Waste from Finished Textile Products» refers to post-consumer waste consisting of clothing products, footwear, accessories, and home textiles, made from leather or hide, discarded by consumers

Erion Textiles is the Compliance Scheme of the Erion System dedicated to **Producers** in the **Textile Industry**






What is meant by **Producer**?

According to the guidelines set by the review of the Waste Framework Directive, a Producer of Finished Textile Products is defined as the **entity who**, regardless of the technique used – whether through sale (including distance selling, on-line or telemarketing), rental, or promotional gifting – is the **first to place a Finished Textile Product on the Italian market**

According to the new legislation, the manufacturer of components (buttons, zippers...) or semi-finished products (yarns, fabrics...) is not considered a "Producer". The exclusive subcontractor is also excluded from the definition of "Producer" and is exempt from any obligations that would arise from it.





Textile waste generated






Flows of urban textile collections

Art. 9 – Structure of the Digital Passport

Tool for simplified use and traceability of information along the entire value chain, essential for market placement or putting into service.

The delegated acts define the requirements:

- data to be entered as a unique identifier, user manuals, manufacturer information, TARIC code* and GTIN code* (Appendix 3)
- · supports to be used and configuration
- whether the product data (PD) is established by model, batch or item, and the definition of such levels
- accessibility without the constraint of purcase, rental, or installment sale, even in case of distance selling
- the entities that must make data accessible and the data that product users must have access to
- who must create the passport or update its data, and which data to insert or update
- methods for introducing and updating the data
- period during which the passport must remain available, at least corresponding to the product's lifespan





DPP simplified




